Lastly, he mentioned the Gloucestershire Wildlife at Robinswood Hill. He instigated the idea of collaborating more with them as a school community as they are local to us. This way, we could look further into the ideas around rewilding and conservation.

However, Filip wrote to him in the hope that our MP would take some responsibility, but he has asked us to make this contact with the Wildlife Trust without mentioning any of the responsibilities he could take as our MP regarding rewilding.

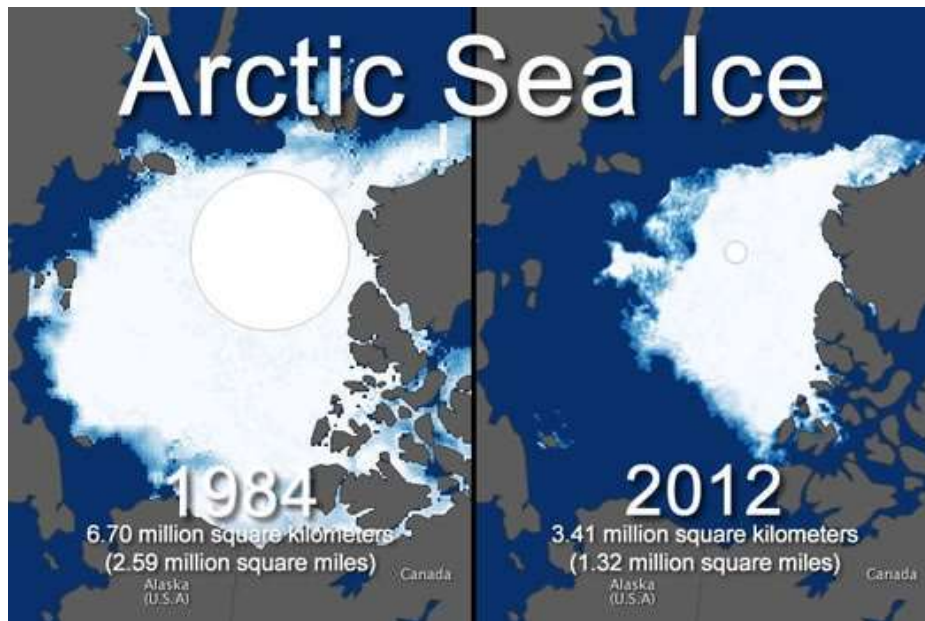
