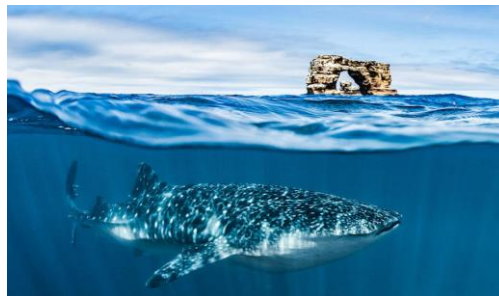


Good News Story!
